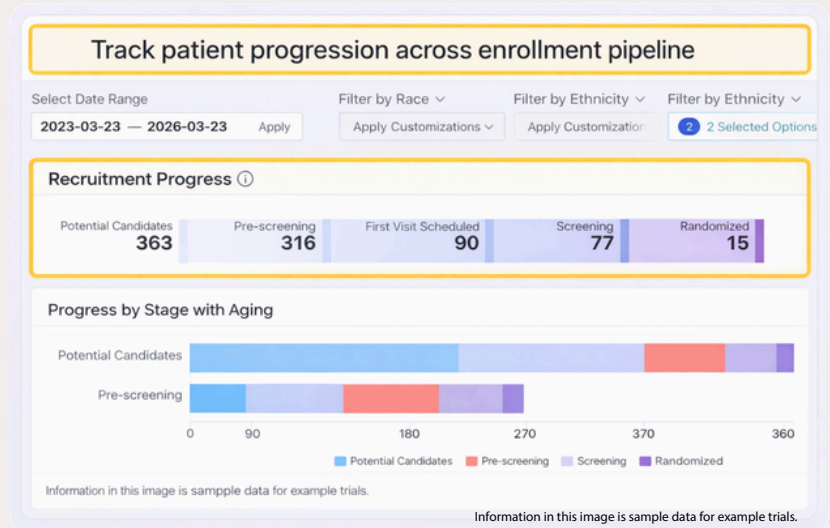
Diversity and representation are essential to developing therapies that are safe and effective for all populations.

Questions this report will answer:

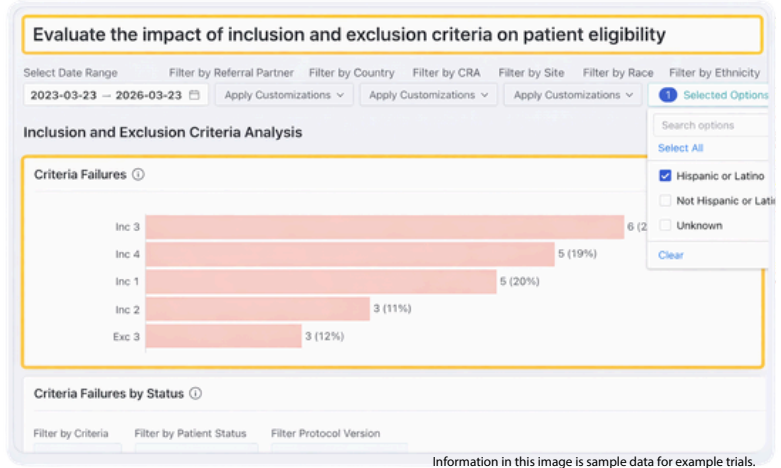
- Are sites engaging a diverse population of patients for the trial?

Understand which inclusion/exclusion criteria most impact patient eligibility

The I/E Criteria report aggregates leading reasons for patient ineligibility across all sites for each study within StudyTeam. By applying race and ethnicity filters, you can identify which I/E criteria disproportionately impacting patients of different races and ethnicities.

Questions this report will answer:

- Are certain I/E criteria disproportionately impacting a particular race or ethnicity?



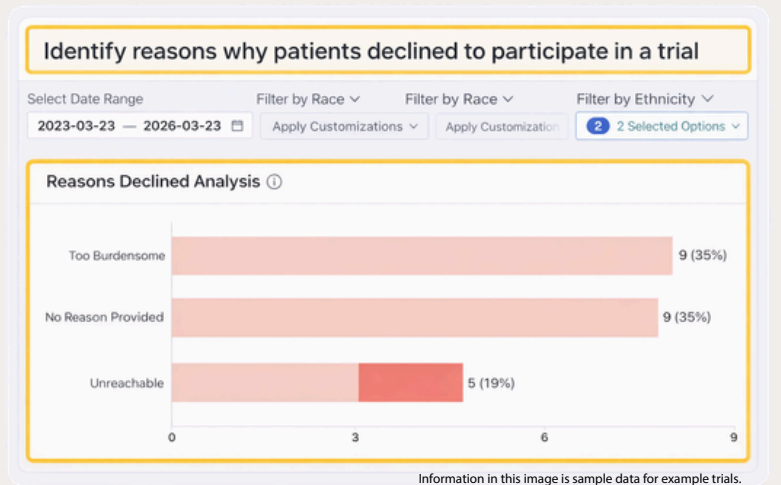
- Is there a particular demographic group that is failing the trial I/E criteria more overall?

Identify and take action on enrollment barriers

The Reasons Declined report displays why patients choose not to participate in a given trial. With race and ethnicity filters, you can identify specific barriers to participation across different populations and better understand where drop-off is occurring.

Questions this report will answer:

- Are particular demographic groups more likely to decline to participate?
- Is there a reason that's causing people from a particular race or ethnicity to decline more than others?
